

Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament: (Fr Andrew Niski)

The priest and altar server will return to the front of the altar. While the priest incenses the Monstrance, all sing :

Tantum ergo Sacramentum Veneremur cernui: Et antiquum documentum Novo cedat ritui Praestet fides supplementum Sensuum defectui.

Genitori, Genitoque Laus et jubilatio Salus, honor, virtus quoque Sit et benedictio: Procedenti ab utroque Compar sit laudatio. (Amen.)

All remain kneeling when the priest says, "Let us pray":

Lord Jesus Christ, you gave us the Eucharist as the memorial of your suffering and death. May our worship of this sacrament of your body and blood help us to experience the salvation you won for us and the peace of the kingdom, where you live with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. (Amen.)

All remain kneeling while the priest elevates the Monstrance and gives the Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament to all.

After the Benediction the priest leads the congregation in the recitation of the:

Divine Praises.

Blessed be God. Blessed be His Holy Name. Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God and true Man. Blessed be the Name of Jesus. Blessed be His Most Sacred Heart. Blessed be His Most Precious Blood. Blessed be Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar. Blessed be the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete. Blessed be the great Mother of God, Mary most Holy. Blessed be her Holy and Immaculate Conception. Blessed be her Glorious Assumption. Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother. Blessed be St. Joseph, her most chaste spouse. Blessed be God in His Angels and in His Saints. Amen.

(all respond)

After a suitable period of silent reflection, the priest deposes the Blessed Sacrament.

All sing :

Praise the Lord for times and seasons, cloud and sunshine, wind and rain; spring to melt the snows of winter till the waters flow again; grass upon the mountain pastures, golden valleys thick with grain. Praise the Lord for times and seasons, cloud and sunshine, wind and rain;

Fill your hearts with joy and gladness, peace and plenty crown your days; love his laws, declare his judgments, walk in all his words and ways; he the Lord and we his children: praise the Lord, all people, praise! Fill your hearts with joy and gladness, peace and plenty crown your days;
