Dear Friends, 21 Jan 22

The Story: I regret that I am a hoarder - tables, drawer, cupboards all filled with stuff. Not throwing anything away just in case there is a future use for it has resulted in the need for a real rummage, and a clearance. I started with piles of books, in a box in the corner of an over-filled room. Guess what? Opening a book, seeing that it was given to me by a friend years ago I began to glance through it. That was the beginning of the end of my clearance. I settled into a chair to read the book. It was 'Smiley's People' by John le Carré. Well it's on the bedside table now, along with 'Tinker, Tailor, Soldier, Spy' by the same author. I think that I have probably every book that he wrote, and with some, several copies, as I accumulated gifts. Yes, there needs to be a clearance, but only after I have sorted them out, and refreshed my memory of the characters and plots. Beside the bed also is a Biography of le Carré, which helps to put some of his stories in their historical context and to understand something of the experience on which the writer drew. Anyone interested in discussing le Carré over a coffee?

When we begin to read the scriptures, or hear them read, we perhaps ought to go over them again, recalling favourite or interesting passages. The gospel writers all had access to different streams of material about Jesus, some from the spoken tradition and some from different written sources. Each Gospel writer wrote from his own perspective, from his own experience of the traditions about Jesus and each shaped their narratives to meet the needs of their readers. Searching for understanding of the Gospel narratives is a task best done prayerfully, accepting the power of the Gospel just as it has come to us. It is useful to let the creative imagination go to work by seeing the stories as they are written, trying to hear the different

voices, scanning the horizons of our minds to visualise it all. How near can we get to it? This approach to the Scriptures enables us to be ruminative, slowly chewing away at the message, and then having a conversation with ourselves. When in a quiet place, we sit and relax and ask the Spirit of God to speak to us in the depths of our understanding we may engage simply with a gem from the story, an insight from Jesus, or the Tradition, which can fill our minds, our hearts and our souls.

'Tell me the old, old story of Jesus and his love' can be a prayerful request as we seek the teaching of Jesus and what his Life means for us. This comes from a favourite hymn of the evangelical tradition:

Tell me the old, old story,
Of unseen things above,
Of Jesus and His glory,
Of Jesus and His love;
Tell me the story simply,
As to a little child,
For I am weak and weary,
And helpless and defiled.

We are all 'weak and weary' at times and we acknowledge the need for the help of God as we face our daily tasks and routines. We may not feel particularly 'defiled' as in the words of the hymn, but most of us would recognise that we have smeared the loveliness of God's goodness in different ways. We live in a world that has been tainted by individual selfishness and greed and this has an impact on every-day life. It is a useful exercise to examine just how we are touched by the world's defilement, its

corruption, greed, and violence. The story of Jesus opens out a new future for us, not just individually, but all of us together. The 'Way of the Synod' is an opportunity given to us by the Holy Father to explore, to listen, to discuss and encourage each other within the Gospel Tradition, 'the old, old, story of Jesus and His love'.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am delighted to be joining you at St Mary's and thank you to those who have welcomed me so far. I have very fond memories of coming here five years ago to visit my good friend Fr Domenico and, going back a further fifteen years, I was a novice under Bishop Hugh at Pluscarden. So I'm not a complete stranger to these parts!

After working as a teacher of English in Sardinia (you may have guessed from my surname that I am half-Italian) and of RE in the south of England, I began my seminary training at the Beda College in Rome in 2010. There I specialised in Islamic Studies and was ordained for the Diocese of Salford in 2014. I thank God for the immense privilege of being able to work so closely alongside the sick and dying, especially over the last two years of the pandemic, and will treasure all the experiences gained there in my heart. I now look forward to this new chapter in my priestly life and hope I can make a positive contribution at St Mary's in the time that I spend here.

As I owe so much of my own spiritual formation to it and particularly because it is celebrating its centenary this year, I am very keen to begin my ministry in Inverness by re-establishing the Legion of Mary in the parish. When it's done well, the Legion provides an easy and concrete way to assist the priest and the parish community as well as growing in personal holiness. In order to introduce this, I will give a talk about the Legion and its founder sometime over the coming weeks, once I have made contact with other local Legionaries, who will need to provide support for the group in its early stages.

I very much look forward to serving you alongside Fr James and Fr Dominic. Please pray for me as I pray for you.


